## State Budget Cuts Will Hurt Public Libraries! Please Help!

The Pennsylvania Senate has proposed a state budget for 2009-2010. Their budget cuts the state funding for public libraries by 50%. In Lebanon County cuts of this magnitude would be devastating: many local libraries will have to cut their hours, all will have to reduce purchases of new books and other materials, and some libraries may even be forced to close. Statewide borrowing and interlibrary loan delivery would cease operations. All of these at a time when many families need to spend less and are depending on their local public libraries more! The Governor's proposed budget also has cuts, though smaller ones, but any cuts right now will hurt Lebanon County libraries.

If all this isn't bad enough, there is more: if the funding for public libraries is drastically cut at the state level as the Senate budget proposes, it will cost Pennsylvania millions of dollars in lost federal funds. It's like a double whammy.

Those who are working at the state in library services are seeing no public outcry to this proposal. You can change that! Please speak up and urge everyone who loves libraries to support library services.

Please write to your state representative, your state senator, and Governor Rendell and tell them about the importance of public libraries in your life. Tell them public libraries are needed by state residents already hurt by the layoffs and financial crisis. Most importantly, **ask them to support level funding for library services next year.** The message is two-fold: 1) Demand for libraries is up dramatically during this recession. 2) Governor Rendell's proposed budget reducing library funding will cost Pennsylvania nearly a million dollars in lost federal money.

Your voice is crucial to public libraries right now and can make a difference!

If you would like to participate in a letter writing campaign, we have copies of all these pre-written, addressed postcards behind the desk. We also have blank, addressed postcards if you'd like to write your own message. Simply ask your librarian for the postcards you'd like to send, affix a stamp, and drop it in a mailbox.
