Books-To-Go Program New in Lebanon County

Lebanon County Libraries, the Lions Club and Lebanon County Sight have joined forces to help qualified visually impaired library patrons continue to enjoy reading material. As a result of this partnership, clients of Lebanon County Sight are now able to enjoy a monthly delivery of large print or audio books. After the client completes a form describing their needs and interests, library staff selects material geared to each individual's tastes and fill a specially marked tote bag. Christy Deiner from Lebanon County Sight makes sure

these bags are delivered. Since its beginnings two years ago, the program has grown from the original 30 people to 53 participants spread across the county. Included are 8 nursing homes, many of which have established book groups for their patrons with the materials. In 2008, over 3,300 items were delivered to county participants. Those enjoying the program are very grateful. In its first year, clients of the Susquehanna Association for the Blind voted to award Lebanon County Libraries the very first White Cane Award in 2007 for this service to the community. One client confessed that when she lost the ability to drive due to her sight, one

of the things she missed the most was her trips to the library. Now the library comes to her.

This program would not be possible without the support of area Lions Clubs, who have supported their local libraries so that visually impaired have access to a current and well-maintained collection. **If you are interested in helping to support this program, deliver books, or if you know someone who might qualify for the service, please contact Christy Deiner from Lebanon County Sight at 867-4300, & leave a message.**
