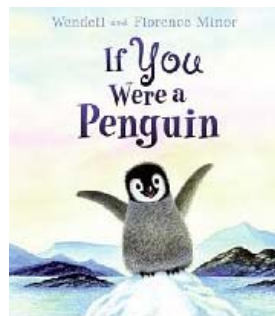

National Volunteer Week

The Lebanon Library is fortunate to have a dedicated army of volunteers who lend us their time and talents. National Volunteer Week is April 19 through April 25. This year, we will launch volunteer recognition week with a luncheon prepared by our library staff to honor the volunteers who assisted us during the past year. In 2008, approximately 124 volunteers provided 7,550 hours of service to the Library. Our volunteers range in age from high school students to nonagenarians (90 plus!). Volunteer services include: shelving returned items, repairing and cleaning damaged items, filing and clerical assistance, calling patrons to inform them their requested items have arrived, simple cleaning and building maintenance, moving library collections, painting, gardening, and grounds maintenance. Approximately forty volunteers visit the library weekly to volunteer their services. The remaining volunteers assist in special projects such as the book sales held by the library and the Friends of the Library and organized community service projects. Bats at the Beach and *Bats at the Library* by Brian Lies

You probably know that when you're going to bed bats are just waking up, but do you know what they actually do all night? In his two picture books, *Bats at the Beach* and *Bats at the Library*, Brian Lies chronicles in beautifully detailed paintings and verse two exciting nights in the life of a bat family.

In *Bats at the Beach* they grab the moon-tan lotion and picnic baskets for a night of wing sailing, sand castle building, and toasting bug-mallows around the campfire.

In *Bats at the Library* they sneak in through an open window for storytelling, research and exploration. As soon as you finish reading you'll want to look at the pictures again to find lots of little details you missed the first time. And be sure to keep an eye out for the littlest bat in his yellow floaties in both books.
