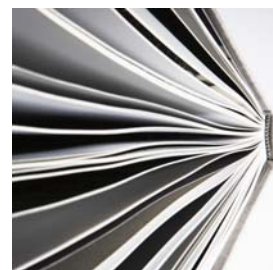

Salt: A World History

By Mark Kurlansky



How much could anyone say about such a simple item as salt? This book will tell you the who, the when and the why of its importance. Not only was it a major element of the wealth of nations and individuals, its abundance kept city-states like Salzburg from becoming part of Austria until the Twentieth century. Not exclusively mined, the production of salt played a big part in the founding of colonies, and their ability to be independent. It also speaks of the wonders of the Polish salt mines where underground cathedrals and ballrooms were carved, and workers used 350-foot wooden slides to get into the mines. While no one would choose to be paid in a cheap commodity of salt today, salt is the origin of the words salary and soldier and referred to their payment. For those devoted non-fiction readers, I predict it will be enjoyable and make you look like a genius at your next party or dinner.
